

FINAL LAKES TREATMENT 2007 AND LAKES CONDITION REPORT

The small lakes at CSL were treated once again on September 10, 2007 by Aquatic Control of Seymour, Indiana who have been the CSL lakes treatment specialists for most of its history. The lakes treated in 2007 have included Wildwood, briarwood and Crestwood on a planned schedule of monthly treatments, and Tanglewood on a one time treatment. September treatment is as follows:

Wildwood – Treated with copper sulfate only – **NO RESTRICTIONS.**

Some Naiads are present in shallow areas. They are below the surface and the lake looks good. We need some rain!

Briarwood – Treated with copper sulfate only – **NO RESTRICTIONS.**

No visible weeds in the lake. Minor microscopic Algae bloom.

Crestwood – Treated with copper sulfate only – **NO RESTRICTIONS.**

Minor microscopic Algae bloom. Weeds are spotty, looks good.

Tanglewood – Checked it out and has the same weeds. Looks good overall considering it was treated only one time.

Overall – the lakes look good although weed growth is a little heavier than I would like in Wildwood. There is just too much shallow water to treat them all effectively. (Remember that this is one of the driest summers in many years and that Wildwood is considerably lower than normal.) They are dying back and will be gone in a month or so.
